Membership Assistant Program (MAP)

Purpose:

To provide financial assistance to members and member organizations to promote and develop basketball as a healthy lifestyle choice for all ages.

Program Goals:

- Provide affordable opportunities for all ages in rural and urban to participate in basketball leagues, programs and clinics.
- Develop a broad participation and competitive base at all ages.
- Ensure an equal opportunity for all people rich or poor, male or female, young or old, and of all ethnic backgrounds to participate in basketball programs.

Funding Available:

Sask Sport provides funding for MAP grants based on previous year members, certified coaches and officials. Therefore, the amount of the grant changes each year. The goal is to distribute the full funding to BSI members without extending over the available funding.

Grant Distribution:

In order to ensure that funds are totally distributed fairly a formula will be used to split the funds among the members. In order to do this all follow-up reports must be submitted by March 1. The grants will be paid out by April 1.

Grant Breakdown:

Special projects – by application (maximum of \$10,000 of the funding)

- New leagues to fund start up costs to a maximum of \$1,000;
- Special development projects.

Operational Costs (all teams)

Player development (minor leagues)

Coach Development – based on number of associate coaches (minor leagues, schools, clubs & individual teams)

Official Development – based on number of associate officials (minor leagues, schools, clubs & individual teams)

Travel (teams required to travel for league play, tournaments and exhibition games not included)

Ineligible Expenditures:

Expenditures within the following areas are ineligible for support:

- Any construction, upgrading, maintenance or operating costs of facilities;
- Subsidization of full-time employees (part-time or seasonal wages utilized in program development are eligible);
- Cash prizes;
- Social events (barbecues, lunches, etc.);
- Alcoholic beverages;
- Research projects or feasibility studies;
- Any other expenses as deemed ineligible by the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture, and Recreation.

How to apply:

- Completion of membership forms and payment of fees automatically registers you for a MAP grant.
- To apply for a special project grant an MAP spending Plan form must be completed.
- To receive the grant you must submit the follow-up report and receipts to cover the amount of the grant by March 1.
- Payment of the grant will be made by April 1.

General Liability and Personal Liability Insurance (\$5 million)

The liability policy will pay legal fees, adjusting expenses and settlement costs for claims brought against an insured which are claiming for compensatory damages arising from and insured's action or alleged negligence causing bodily injury, property damage or personal injury. Claims for negligence covered from insurance would arise from:

- Premises occupied by you and operations conducted by your organization;
- Bodily injury to spectators arising out of sports & social activities sanctioned by BSI;
- Products sold or distributed;
- Actions of independent contractors you may employ but only with respect to your vicarious liability;
- Liability assumed under a contract you have entered into;
- Accusations of false arrest, wrongful detention or imprisonment, libel, slander, defamation or malicious prosecution;
- Liability for injury to an employee who is normally covered by Worker's Compensation but where WCB denies coverage;
- Liability arising out of the use and operation of vehicles not owned by an insured;
- Claims for incidental malpractice where a person may become further injured following application of first aid treatment;
- Damage to facilities rented or leased by you.

A "Sanctioned Event" includes all games, competitions or sport demonstrations run by a member club authorized by BSI, including related training at the event site and at club premises. Social activities and fund raising activities including those involving liquor are also covered providing it is sanctioned by BSI.

Secondary Sport Accident Insurance

When Covered:

- BSI sanctioned and organized practices and competitions;
- Transportation to and from events (2 or more traveling together with a minimum distance of 100km traveled);
- Regularly scheduled commercial air lines, licensed charter.

Death (Principal sum): \$25,000

Loss Schedule: \$2,000 to times principal sum

Paralysis: 2 x principal sum

Prosthetics: \$3,000

Blanket Medical Reimbursement: same limit as principle sum

Rehabilitation: \$3,000

Tuition: \$2,000

Special Treatment Travel: \$1,000

Out-of-province: \$10,000

Emergency Transportation: \$50

Eyeglass and contact lenses: \$100

Dental Accident: \$5,000

Dentures, Artificial Teeth: \$200 (includes hearing aids)

Fracture Indemnity: \$50 - \$500

Optional add-on to extend cover for incidents that occur outside of Canada can be purchased for \$1/day/person. This is purchased prior to the travel. At least 2 days notice is required.
